The Winter Olympic Games began in 1924 in Chamonix, France, followed by:

1956 Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy
1960 Squaw Valley, US
1964 Innsbruck, Austria
1968 Grenoble, France
1972 Sapporo, Japan
1976 Innsbruck, Austria
1980 Lake Placid, US
1984 Sarajevo, Yugoslavia
1988 Calgary, Canada
1992 Albertville, France
1994 Lillehammer, Norway
1998 Nagano, Japan
2002 Salt Lake City, US
and 2006 Turin, Italy.

Due to World War I and II, the Summer Games were not held in 1916, 1940 and 1944. The Winter Games were not held in 1940 and 1944.
